UNIVERSITY AWARDED GRANT —

The University of New Hampshire has received a \$3 million grant from the National Science Foundation to share its faculty's expertise in earth sciences with middle and high school teachers. Through the new program, called Transforming Earth System Science Education, UNH faculty members will provide professional training to teachers. Dillard University in New Orleans, Elizabeth City State University in North Carolina, and Pennsylvania State University will share the grant to create two-week summer institutes and year-round scientist-in-residence programs for teachers. The first institute will be held at UNH July 23 to Aug. 3.
